Anne Frank	<b>1) The Holocaust: an introduction for younger learners</b> This programme introduces the students to the Holocaust. Using the story of Anne Frank or Hannah's Suitcase, learners will get a brief overview of this period in history.	Grade 5 - 8
Sophie Scholl: a Cerman student and anti-Nazi political activist	<b>2) Moral Choices during the Holocaust</b> This session looks at moral choices made by people during the Holocaust with a focus on perpetrators, bystanders, upstanders and victims.
