BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAMME

1) The Holocaust: an introduction for younger learners

This programme introduces the students to the Holocaust. Using the story of Anne Frank or Hannah's Suitcase, learners will get a brief overview of this period in history.

2) Moral Choices during the Holocaust

This session looks at moral choices made by people during the Holocaust with a focus on perpetrators, bystanders, upstanders and victims. It encourages learners to think about moral choices which they are confronted with on a daily basis.

3) Upstanders: Rescue and Resistance

We examine examples of physical and spiritual resistance to the Nazis through the stories of individuals who risked their lives to save Jews and other victims of Nazi persecution during WW2.

This is an opportunity for the learners to reflect on the difference between voicing opposition within a democratic state, a totalitarian state and a world at war.

CHANGE MAKERS PROGRAMME

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAMME

This programme will examine three different case studies - The Holocaust, the Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda and Apartheid. By learning from the difficult pasts presented in all case studies we aim to promote pluralism and counter extremism.

During this programme learners will be taught critical thinking and leadership skills to resist violence and to challenge the ideas of extremism by becoming upstanders and change makers within their communities.

Learners will gain an insight into the life and remarkable work of Janusz Korczak (pictured), who was a doctor, educationalist, writer and head of the orphanage in the Warsaw Ghetto. Learners will have an opportunity to study his ideas on discipline and children's rights and relate these to contemporary life today.


12) Combating Bullying
